Tim Morris expressed his concern about Walnut Township employees entering people's properties and said he would not agree to do that. Jane asked how these fees would be collected. Trustee Horn replied that the fees would come from the offending property owner. Trustee Horn said that unpaid fees would be placed on the property owner's tax bill. Trustee Yates said that the township would be responsible for asbestos cleanup, well cleanup; etc. He said that this could result in unexpected expense to the Township. Trustee Yates asked about the appeal process. Trustee Horn replied that anyone would have the right to appeal through the court system. Property owner Larry asked how long the appeal process and Trustee Horn was not sure of the answer. He asked what other townships were utilizing the same maintenance code: Amanda Township, Thurston, Baltimore Village and City of Lancaster utilize the maintenance code Trustee Horn said that the trustees could work with the Land Bank on foreclosed/condemned properties.
